See I met Kipp through Bob Shaver and I found him in the newspaper - I wanted to buy a horse and I did just that a beautiful black American Pony stocky long mane and tail - Bob tried to talk me out of this choice because as he put it they have a mean streak - well he was right so shortly after purchasing ACE I wanted to trade him in - Bob said come down Saturday evening and he gave me a time and before I knew it Ace was loaded up in his horse trailer and we were off to an auction barn.

I didn't know Kipp and Sandy at this point - Bob sat me down in the barn knowing he sat me in front of the girls "I didn't know" - Sandy introduced herself and Kipp sat with her Busch beer glaring at me - like who was I - hahaha Bob was a funny man god rest his soul. A relationship between us became inseperable Me Kipp, Sandy - Little Bill and Big Bill and our horses.

I had more respect for this Kipp the biggest humanitarian I've ever known - she is the definition of humanitarian - I've seen her take a dying man his name is Pete and his 2 children and give him life and them a home - together they raised 2 responsible young adults and married and shared a loving life together.
